LAUNDRY & LAUNDRY BAGS

Tamakwa contracts out the camp laundry to a nearby laundry company. The laundry goes out once a week and is returned within 24 hours. We will provide each camper with a "camp issue" laundry bag. This official Camp Tamakwa laundry bag is the ONLY bag permitted for use in the camp laundry.

We use a very reliable laundry service, but remember that it is still camp laundry. So please don't send any clothes you would be concerned about if it were to get damaged or sometimes lost in the laundry.

LOST & FOUND

No matter how hard we all try to keep campers united with their belongings, things get left behind and misplaced. Usually if they get **lost**, they also get **found**. We comb activity areas daily for lost articles, collect them all in our central Lost & Found box, and then distribute it back among their owners – which we can only do if the item is clearly marked with a name. We repeat this procedure right up to the campers' departure. It's not a perfect system, but the best chances of success lie with things that are clearly marked with a name. Camp is not responsible for lost or stolen property but we would rather have fewer belongings left behind after camp.
